

MU Accommodation and Catering Services Director's Order No. 11/2018

**Using personal electrical appliances brought into the
Masaryk University halls of residence**

(in the version in force as from April 1st, 2025)

Article 1

Preliminary provisions

Following the Order of Masaryk University No. 8/2017- Accommodation Rules of University Halls of Residence and the Accommodation Contract, I hereby issue these instructions, which specify the rules for using electrical appliances brought into MU halls of residence.

Article 2

Rules for using brought-in electrical appliances

- (1) In accordance with the Accommodation Rules of Masaryk University halls of residence and the Accommodation Contract, the accommodated person (hereinafter referred to as the "notifier of the electrical appliance") is obliged to notify the accommodator in advance of all the electrical appliances he/she brings to the halls of residence.
- (2) The mandatory notification of the electrical appliance brought in by the notifier of the electrical appliance pursuant to the preceding paragraph shall also apply to "Information and communication technology" (desktop computer, monitor, small printer, mobile workstation, laptop, power supply unit, speakers, cell phone, tablet).
- (3) The notifier of the electrical appliance is responsible for ensuring that the electrical appliance complies with all legal and other regulations, including technical standards, particularly safety and fire regulations. He or she is also responsible for its proper operational and technical condition, and for operating the equipment in accordance with these regulations and standards.
- (4) The notifier of the electrical appliance is obliged to ensure that all the appliances are switched off or unplugged from the electric outlet, including all its accessories, before leaving the halls of residence. This obligation does not apply to desktop computers or laptops for a time period of up to 2 hours.
- (5) The notifier of the electrical appliance shall be liable for any damage caused by the operation of the brought-in electrical equipment.
- (6) The maximum input power of the simultaneously connected electrical appliances in the room is 2000 W.
- (7) Electric kettles (only 1 per room) can be used provided they are disconnected from the power supply when not used and their power does not exceed the value given in paragraph 6.
- (8) It is forbidden to use any radio equipment (HW or SW) and connections operating in the 2.4 and 5 GHz license zones, except the devices which directly serve client connection to the eduroam or MUNI network provided by MU and installed by the Accommodation and Catering Services of Masaryk University. Routine checks are carried out electronically and personally. This concerns for example:
 - a) WiFi access points (APs), routers, hotspots and all WiFi ad hoc connections,

- b) WiFi baby monitors.
- (9) It is forbidden:
- a) to use simultaneously kitchen appliances over 2000 W,
 - b) to connect and use electric appliances and accessories such as extension cables, socket splitters, unauthorised plug-in reductions and other similar devices; as well as grills, fryers (except for hot air fryers), toasters, sandwich toasters, electric heaters, electric scooters, electric bicycles and similar devices, in the rooms and in the common areas of Masaryk University Halls of residence.
 - c) store electrical appliances on combustible materials.

Article 3
Final provisions

- (1) The Head of the Technical Services and IT Department of SKM shall be in charge of interpreting the individual provisions, updating them and checking compliance with these instructions.
- (2) These instructions shall enter into force on the date of signature.
- (3) These instructions become effective on April 1st, 2025.
